TOPIC: Heroes and Villains

OUTCOMES:

TASK DESCRIPTION:

All cultures have stories about heroes and villains who try to save the day, or create havoc, respectively.

PART A – Superman Report

Using either of your class texts (the graphic novel *Superman – Earth One*, or the film *Man of Steel*), create a report including the following, using the sub-headings provided below:

- **Plot summary,** including the structural elements of the story (in 100 words approximately). This includes what happens in the orientation, complication and resolution.
- A **profile composed of THREE character traits** for a hero or a villain of <u>your choice</u> from the given text, including examples and/or quotations that demonstrate these traits. This section may be written in bullet points.
- An outline of one **main theme** explored in the text, including an explanation of how your chosen hero or villain carries this theme. You must provide textual references (examples and/or quotations from the text).

PART B - Presentation of a Monologue

Imagine you are either a hero or a villain from either of your class texts (the graphic novel, *Superman – Earth One*, or the film *Man of Steel*). Present a **3 minute** monologue in which you describe/recount a major complication. You must deliver your speech as though you are that character. Your audience (who you are pitching your speech to) are Year 6 students.

Your monologue must feature the following components:

- 1. A description/recount of the complication and your involvement in the event.
- **2.** If you are a hero, explain how and why you resolved this complication, using reasons from the text.

OR

If you are a villain, explain how and why you contributed to the complication, using reasons from the text.

3. If you are a hero, analyse the character traits that led you to resolve the complication. This means, you will be justifying why you are a hero.

OR

If you are a villain, analyse the character traits that led you to cause the complication. This means, you will be justifying why you are a villain.

N.B. You must submit a transcript on the due date.

SUBMISSION DETAILS:

- Part A is to be submitted on an A4 sheet, word processed using size 12, Times New Roman font
- Computer or printer failure will not be accepted as an excuse for late submission.
- A hard copy must be submitted on the due date, including your transcript (electronic copies will not be accepted)
- Requests for extensions must be made before the due date and be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- You must be present on the day of the assessment (12th September) otherwise you will receive a zero and a letter home to your parents. If you are absent, you must obtain a doctor's certificate and give it in to Ms Strauss to be exempt from the zero penalty.
